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CONFERENCE MISSION STATEMENT

The California Indian Conference provides a forum for the sharing of knowledge, scholarship, and issues of importance related to Native California. The conference brings together California Indians, academics, tribal scholars, educators and students, public agencies and institutions, tribal communities and organizations, and the general public.

PROPOSAL ESSENTIALS

Provide a letter from someone in your institution at the dean or higher level, preferably the president, stating that the institution will sponsor the conference and provide monetary support (\$10,000 minimum) and resources in support of the conference, including:

- Release time for one course per semester for one year to fulfill the functions of the conference coordinator (a full-time faculty member)
- Student assistants
- Venue costs that will be waived or covered (eg. parking, the conference building, food)
- Description of preliminary conference committee, with names listed of the people who are willing to participate.
- A list of local tribes with an indication of their support for the conference, ideally in the form of attached letters
- Any special things you have to offer, such as that a local tribe will sponsor a barbecue, or the art department will sponsor an exhibition.

You or a representative should be prepared to attend the conference business meeting to present your proposal. If you cannot attend, please contact one of us (see above) to help you with that.

Before you submit your proposal, you should contact the Annual California Indian Conference Coordinating Committee to confirm your intention to submit a proposal.
